The Huck Homestead: A North Fork Legacy Art Exhibit

The Belton Chalet is pleased to welcome this collaborative exhibit by the local Huck-Ramon family of the North Fork, featuring art pieces by Helen Huck, Robert Huck, and Ted Huck-Ramon. The exhibit demonstrates the geographical and human history of the Belton Chalet and Glacier National Park.

A brief summary of the Huck family history:

Seven years after the Glacier National Park boundary was established on the east side of the North Fork of the Flathead river, Henry Milton Huck and Ethel Elizabeth Huck of South Dakota made their way west on the train with their eldest children to stake their homestead claim of 160 acres. Their daughter Helen and son Robert developed a love of art and the beautiful scenery surrounding them, ultimately creating richly textured oils, vibrant watercolors, and impressionistic woodcuts. The Belton Chalet historically hosted exhibits of Helen and brother Robert's art, and is pleased to welcome the family back for another showing after several decades.
